

Tips for Testing Middle & High School Students (Triple Factor Hearing Screener)

When testing older students, it's about managing their expectations.



Include the following in your explanation to students prior to testing:

- It's a simple game that checks your hearing
- You need to listen carefully
- There will be times when you can't hear anything - that's part of the test as it works out what is the quietest sound that you can hear
- If you can't hear anything, wait. The sounds will get louder, respond when you hear the sound again
- It's not about responding quickly
- Everyone will finish at different times



Utilize the Trial Run activities

- Quit out of the Trial Run activities as soon as it's obvious the student knows what to do



If a Fail or Borderline result is received, a second test must be done to confirm the results.

- Ideally the second test should not be done immediately afterwards (due to listening fatigue), we recommend waiting a day.
